### ORDER SETTING HEARING

Michael J. Quilling, as Receiver for Funding Resource Group and related entities, has filed a motion to allow Cindy Meir to file a claim out of time. As grounds for the motion, the Receiver explains that Meir recently contacted him about filing a \$10,000 claim against the Funding Resource Group Estate. This claim is consistent with the books and records of the Receiver. However, Meir never received a claim form and was unable to submit her claim by the original deadline of March 31, 2001.<sup>1</sup> If approved, her *pro rata* interim distribution will be \$1,229.34. In view of these facts, the Receiver seeks court approval of the claim and authority to make an interim distribution to Meir. The Securities and Exchange Commission, by and through its regional counsel, does not oppose the relief sought.

A hearing on the motion is set for October 25, 2002 at 9:00 a.m. in the courtroom of U.S. Magistrate Judge Jeff Kaplan, 1100 Commerce Street, 16th Floor, Dallas, Texas. Written objections to the motion must be filed by October 21, 2002. All interested persons will be given an opportunity to present their objections at the hearing.
