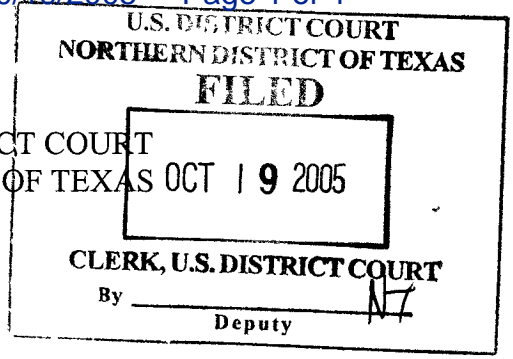

**RECEIVER'S UNOPPOSED MOTION TO  
SELL PERSONAL PROPERTY ITEMS VIA EBAY AUCTION**

TO THE HONORABLE SAM A. LINDSAY, UNITED STATES DISTRICT JUDGE:

COMES NOW, Michael J. Quilling ("Receiver") and files this his Unopposed Motion to Sell Personal Property Items Via eBay Auction and in support of such would respectfully show unto the Court as follows:

1. On July 1, 2005 the Securities and Exchange Commission ("SEC") initiated Civil Action No. 3:05-CV-1328-L currently styled *Securities and Exchange Commission v. Megafund Corporation, Stanley A. Leitner, Sardaukar Holdings, IBC, Bradley C. Stark, CIG, Ltd., and James A. Rumpf, Individually and d/b/a Cilak International and Pamela C. Stark, Relief Defendant*, and in connection therewith sought the appointment of a Receiver as to the Defendants and Relief

Defendant. By Order dated July 5, 2005 in the SEC Proceedings, Michael J. Quilling was appointed as Receiver and has continued to function in that capacity since that time.

2. By subsequent Order dated July 19, 2005 in the SEC Proceedings, the receivership was expanded to include additional individuals and entities, including CIG, Ltd. and James A. Rumpf, Individually and d/b/a Cilak International. By virtue of the same Order, Michael J. Quilling was appointed as Receiver for each of the additional individuals and entities and he continues to function in that capacity since that time.

3. Pursuant to paragraph 11 of the Amended Order Appointing Receiver, the Receiver is authorized, in his discretion, to abandon or sell assets which are less than \$1,500 in value without obtaining further order of the Court.

4. In performance of his duties, the Receiver has taken possession of hundreds of items of personal property located in a storage unit in Riverside, California under the control of Bradley C. Stark which items were purchased using investor funds. The Receiver has also taken possession of various personal property items from the offices of Megafund Corp., CILAK International and Jim Rumpf's house. Those items have been photographed and roughly valued. It is the Receiver's intention to dispose of the items via eBay auctions in an attempt to obtain the highest price possible in the quickest time frame. Most of the items will sell for less than \$500 and, thus, the Receiver already has approval to sell those items. However, some of the items may exceed \$1,500 in value and, accordingly, the Receiver requests that the Court enter an order authorizing him to sell the personal property items described above at such price as he is able to obtain via eBay auction, even if the price exceeds \$1,500.




